Law Minor Requirements:

- 18 total units, 9 UD units. 3 units in residence.
- GPA of 2.00 required in Law minor.
 - O UD = upper division, 300-499 level courses.

Declare the Law Minor:

- Sign up online only: https://sgpp.arizona.edu/declare
- Students must have a 2.0 overall GPA or higher
 OR be in their first term at UA.

Law School Interest?

- Law minor is <u>NOT</u> a requirement to apply to law school.
 Students can pursue any major/minor before law school.

Enrollment Restrictions:

- Students pursuing an SGPP major (LAW, POL, CJS, or PAF)
 are <u>NOT</u> permitted to complete the Law minor.
- This minor is best completed by students in the Junior and/or Senior year. First-Year/Sophomore students can access some limited classes.
- Course availability is **NOT** guaranteed for minor students.
- Some courses require advanced <u>class standing</u>.
 - Junior (60+ completed units)
 - Senior (90+ completed units).
- Some courses have enrollment pre-requisite requirements.
 - Confirm your eligibility to enroll in courses (pg. 4)
- Courses may <u>NOT</u> be shared between the Law minor and your major/s or another minor.
- Pass/Fail Credit not acceptable, except for Internships.
- Maximum 3 units of appropriate <u>SGPP</u> or <u>LAW</u> Internship credit may apply to the Law minor.










How to View Enrollment Restrictions: pre-requisites and/or class standing requirements
