

# Criminal Justice Studies

<b>Law enforcement</b>	Law enforcement's job is to uphold the law, as well as protect and serve the people. This job may entail questioning, investigating, or detaining people.
<b>Research Analyst</b>	A research analyst is a data-savvy professional who helps businesses or organizations make informed decisions based on market trends, customer behavior, and financial performance.
<b>Community Liaison</b>	A Community Liaison is a professional who facilitates the process of developing communities by managing communication between local institutions and their citizens.
<b>Policy analyst</b>	Policy analysts devise new policies, make policy changes and share their research with government officials and legislators. They might specialize in a specific type of policy, such as education, defense or energy.
<b>Advocacy manager</b>	The job of an Advocacy Manager involves overseeing the implementation of advocacy strategies of the organization. He/she must have extensive experience in policy, promotional and advocacy work.
<b>Political consultant</b>	A political consultant, sometimes called a campaign consultant, works with politicians to help them run successful election campaigns. Consultants may collaborate with other professionals, like public relations managers or accountants, to create campaigns that improve a candidate's public image. Sometimes, political consultants may also work with businesses or organizations to help them navigate current events and regulatory changes or with lobbyists to push legislative changes.
<b>Government administrator</b>	Public administrators can have a meaningful impact in their area of involvement, shaping policies that influence the community. Administrators are often the public face of the government or an agency, interfacing with constituent groups.
<b>Case Manager</b>	A case manager is a specialized social worker who oversees and coordinates continued care for patients with long-term or chronic illnesses. They will inform medical staff of the patient's plan of care.
<b>Victim Advocate</b>	A victim advocate will connect individuals to appropriate resources, such as counseling, financial tools, academic support, and legal services, as well as protect your client and ensure they are receiving the care they need throughout the process.
<b>Fraud investigator</b>	A fraud investigator is required to have a wide knowledge of fraud laws. Someone in this position will gather evidence and perform interviews to investigate any claims of fraud.
