## Law Careers

| Public Affairs<br>Specialist           | A public affairs specialist works for an organization promoting its services and communicating with the public on its behalf.  |
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| Political Analyst                      | Political analysts advise and consult about political issues with civic bodies, research agencies, political parties and government officials. They collect, analyze and interpret political data to develop political theories and forecast social, economic and political trends.  |
| Policy analyst                         | Policy analysts devise new policies, make policy changes and share their research with government officials and legislators. They might specialize in a specific type of policy, such as education, defense or energy.   |
| Advocacy<br>manager                    | The job of an Advocacy Manager involves overseeing the implementation of advocacy strategies of the organization. He/she must have extensive experience in policy, promotional and advocacy work.  |
| Political consultant                   | A political consultant, sometimes called a campaign consultant, works with politicians to<br>help them run successful election campaigns. Consultants may collaborate with other<br>professionals, like public relations managers or accountants, to create campaigns that<br>improve a candidate's public image. Sometimes, political consultants may also work with<br>businesses or organizations to help them navigate current events and regulatory<br>changes or with lobbyists to push legislative changes. |
| Government<br>administrator            | Public administrators can have a meaningful impact in their area of involvement, shaping policies that influence the community. Administrators are often the public face of the government or an agency, interfacing with constituent groups.  |
| Corporate<br>communications<br>manager | A corporate communications manager is responsible for overseeing and executing the internal and external communication strategies of an organization. They manage communication channels like social media, websites, media relations, newsletters, and marketing materials. They also write and distribute content and messages that describe and promote the organization and its products, adhering to its brand and vision.  |
| Public Relations<br>Manager            | A public relations manager is a professional who leads the public facing communications of a business or organization.   |
| Media relations<br>manager             | A media relations manager acts as the liaison between a company, institution, public official, or celebrity and the media to promote good news about the organization or client and maintain their reputation.   |

| Legislative<br>assistant/aide | Legislative assistants have a wide range of responsibilities, which can include: 1.<br>Providing advice to legislators on issues related to their work, including drafting<br>correspondence, speeches, bills, and other documents 2. Reviewing bills introduced in<br>the legislature for procedural correctness and drafting, etc. |
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| Campaign<br>manager           | A campaign manager, campaign chairman, or campaign director is a paid or volunteer<br>individual whose role is to coordinate a political campaign's operations such as<br>fundraising, advertising, polling, getting out the vote (with direct contact to the public),<br>and other activities supporting the effort, directly.      |
| Research analyst              | A research analyst is a data-savvy professional who helps businesses or organizations<br>make informed decisions based on market trends, customer behavior, and financial<br>performance.  |
| Community<br>Liaison          | A Community Liaison is a professional who facilitates the process of developing communities by managing communication between local institutions and their citizens.   |
| Case Manager                  | A case manager is a specialized social worker who oversees and coordinates continued care for patients with long-term or chronic illnesses. They will inform medical staff of the patient's plan of care.  |
| Victim Advocate               | A victim advocate will connect individuals to appropriate resources, such as counseling, financial tools, academic support, and legal services, as well as protect your client and ensure they are receiving the care they need throughout the process.  |
| Fraud investigator            | A fraud investigator is required to have a wide knowledge of fraud laws. Someone in this position will gather evidence and perform interviews to investigate any claims of fraud.  |
| Legislative Liaison           | A legislative liaison will study the origin, development, and operation of political systems.<br>They will act as a resource for local discussions of legislation and contemplated<br>legislation. They may identify issues or concerns of the local community in legislation.   |
| Compliance<br>Specialist      | A compliance specialist will ensure that an organization remains compliant with all regulations and policies based on local laws and federal regulations.  |
| Paralegal/Legal<br>Assistant  | A paralegal, or legal assistant, helps lawyers prepare for hearings, trials, and other proceedings. They may conduct research, prepare reports and other documents, or file materials for cases.   |
| Law Clerk                     | While often a lawyer, a law clerk does not always have to be an attorney. A law clerk will provide counsel and assistance to a lawyer or judge by researching issues and drafting legal opinions prior to a case.  |
