| George R. Cunningham Scholarship | Graduate student pursuing Masters in Public Admin in the School of Government and Public Policy, with professional experience in and/or demonstrating commitment to public sector budgeting/ economics/ finance. |
| William Hibbs Scholarship | A Student majoring in criminal justice administration who at the end of his/her junior year, has one of the three highest cumulative grades averages among juniors majoring in criminal justice administration. |
| Lee Rupert Scholarship | Upper division and graduate student in the area of criminal justice, Those student who are involved in extracurricular activities in criminal justice will be given preference. |
| William McConico Scholarship | Upper division students in the School of Government and Public Policy majoring in Public Administration, selected on the basis of character, grade average not below 3.0 and interest in professional advancement. |
| Charles Brady and Adela Maldonado Scholarship | Applicants must be in junior or senior standing and majoring in Political Science. Recipient will be selected on a basis of academic excellence, future promise and financial need. They must also be graduates of Arizona high schools and citizens of the United States. |
| Jens N. Brodersen Memorial Scholarship | Applicants must be a Political Science major with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Preference given to students demonstrating financial need. |
| Rombach Institute Scholarship | Applicants must be majoring in Criminal Justice Studies, Law, or Public Management & Policy, or pursuing a Master's in Public Administration at the UA. Funding will be given on the basis of financial need, academic achievement and/or potential for educational and career success. Preference will be given to students participating in extra-curricular activities in criminal justice, in junior and senior standing, and/or in the MPA program. |
| Erica Lyn Bowden Scholarship | Applicants must be in junior or senior standing majoring in Public Management and Policy with a concentration in Criminal Justice Administration, and must have a cumulative GPA of at least a 2.75. Preference will be given to a student that displays high personal and educational goals, motivation, responsibility, leadership skills, communication skills, and a spirit of volunteerism and university/community involvement as well as participating in Criminal Justice Society activities. |
| Victor B. Kelley Scholarship | Applicants must be in junior or senior standing, be majoring in Political Science, and demonstrate financial need. |
| Ruben D Suarez Scholarship | Applicants must be majoring in Public Management and Policy and must be a graduate of a high school in Pima County. Preference will be given to students who are eligible for upper division courses. |
